What is Discipleship?

Our denomination has described the mission of The United Methodist Church as making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. As a local church, we have been tasked with what a fully formed disciple looks like in our context.

Over the years, particularly coming out of the modern scientific era, discipleship ministries have been based on the core definition of a disciple as a “learner”. This was easy and convenient. We could “teach” about what it means to be a disciple. So the Church developed a very academic approach to equipping disciples. Yearlong treks through the Bible became the norm. For those who wanted to dig deeper there were verse by verse studies of particular books. Then we added themed studies around the topics that could help people understand how to live as better disciples.

So, here we are in the post-modern era and a number of studies have been done to see how all this focus on learning and teaching has worked. And the answer is: It didn't! We missed the part of the definition of disciple as learning that focused on actually becoming like Jesus, not just learning about Jesus..

So, let's be clear...

- Discipleship is not about learning about Jesus. It is about becoming like Jesus.
- Discipleship is not about education. It is about transformation.
- Discipleship is not about knowledge. It is about behaviors.

A disciple is a follower of Jesus Christ who is committed to:

- Being part of the Body of Christ.
- Becoming more like Jesus.
- Joining Jesus in ministry.

It is important to note that for each of these three areas presented, it is not identified how the person will live that out. Discipleship is a very personal journey and what works for one person will not necessarily work for another. However, there are several dimensions of discipleship that relate to these three broad strokes identified in the definition. For our congregation, we've described our discipleship journey as:

- Invite ... we invite people into a relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Grow ... we grow people in God's grace.
- Serve ... we serve our neighbors.

Indeed, this journey has emerged from our mission, journey and vision statements.

Our spiritual growth team is currently conducting a survey across the congregation to help discover how our current discipleship offerings match the congregation's need for invite, grow, serve opportunities. This survey was distributed on Sunday, October 18th, in Sunday morning worship. If you missed taking the survey, you are encouraged to stop by the church office and take the survey. It is brief and anonymous, taking no more than ten minutes to complete. Please help us help you in growing in God's grace!

God Is With Us

On the heels of the celebration on Sunday evening, October 11th, when we enjoyed a sneak peek potluck and multimedia presentation by Pullman Company and their associates, I read the following meditation for Tuesday, October 13th, in *The Upper Room* daily devotional. I thought it so appropriate to our experience this past year that I wanted to share it with you today:

Isaiah 43:1-7

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

- Isaiah 43:2-3

Australia is a land of sweeping plains, rugged mountain ranges, droughts, and flooding rains. Our region had experienced years of drought. Then last summer three floods came across our farm in a three-month period. We were safe, but surrounded by water. We did not lose any livestock; but we did lose crops, which left us with a financial loss. Fences and roads were swept away, and debris was left everywhere. The cleanup kept us busy for months.

My eyes were opened when I read today's reading from Isaiah: "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you" – "when" not "if"! We will pass through waters and walk through fire; but God promises, "I am the LORD your God ... your Savior.... Do not fear, for I am with you." We can trust in God because God is faithful. When we realize what God has done for us, we don't need to be afraid of whatever disasters happen in the world. God has formed us and called us by name. God loves us, redeems us, and blots out our sins. What a privilege to belong to such a great and gracious God!

Prayer: We love you, Lord. When the floods and fires come, we are thankful for your presence with us. What a comfort it is to know that you are our God, the Holy One, our Savior! Amen. - Janine Randell (New South Wales, Australia)

Nominations Committee

Bookstudy – The Gospel of Mary of Magdala Jesus and the First Woman Apostle

Professor of Ecclesiastical History at Harvard University

Lost for more than fifteen hundred years, the Gospel of Mary is the only existing early Christian gospel written in the name of a woman. Karen L. King tells the story of the recovery of this remarkable gospel and offers a new translation. This brief narrative presents a radical interpretation of Jesus' teachings as a path to inner spiritual knowledge. It rejects his suffering and death as a path to eternal life and exposes the view that Mary Magdalene was a prostitute for what it is – a piece of theological fiction. The Gospel of Mary of Magdala offers a fascinating glimpse into the conflicts and controversies that shaped earliest Christianity.

Elaine Pagles says: "Karen King's Gospel of Mary of Magdala is a book that many readers are waiting for. – a complete translation of the Gospel of Mary together with a lucidly written, marvelously informative discussion of where it comes from and what it means."
