Honoring ...

... the Legacy of our Past ... the Providence of our Present ... the Hope of our Future

For more than 163 years, those who have gone before us have bequeathed those who followed an opportunity to give at the First United Methodist Church of Napa. Their faithfulness and loyalty have enhanced our sense of pride and dedication to the Church that each succeeding generation has given to the next. It has often been said over this past year of reconstruction that, if we had to pay for the reconstruction of the entire sanctuary, this congregation, and few congregations, could afford the bill. The artistry and craftsmanship that originally contributed to the sanctuary we have today simply would be financially out of reach by most congregations today.

At the time we were conducting last year's general fund campaign, we had not yet received the final word on what our California Nevada Conference was prepared to gift us from the Earthquake Self-Insurance Fund. In fact, it would not be until the closing days of December, 2014, that we would discover the fullness of God's providence and connectional generosity in the amount of \$1,552,500 of the estimated \$1,900,000 cost of repairs and retrofitting! And, yet, even in the midst of all the uncertainty of construction financing, we, as a congregation, still pledged an estimate which far exceeded the previous two years.

It would be later in the Spring of 2015 that we would discover the generosity of the Gasser Foundation's remarkable gift of \$125,000 plus an additional \$50,000 to guarantee the servicing of a loan pending by the Bank of Napa for an additional \$650,000 to pay for the remainder of the costs of reconstruction as well as add-ons which seemed prudent while the walls were opened. Additional gifts from the Chamber Music in Napa Valley, our partner in bringing the acoustic arts alive in the Napa Valley, made major financial contributions to provide excellence in the acoustic treatment of the new plaster on the walls of the sanctuary as well as the construction of a new, hardwood platform for use as a chancel.

But perhaps the most remarkable sign of God's providence was the gracious invitation by our Napa Community Seventh-day Adventist friends of the use of their sanctuary and adjacent facilities on Sunday mornings free of charge until we were able to move back into our own worship space! This sign of providence and generosity has been reported by news agencies across the Bay Area and beyond!

And, amazingly, even in the midst of all this relocation and construction, we've continued to grow as a congregation with the addition of seven new young adults in our most recent membership class. We've also started, thanks to new member

Patty Bilhartz, a Carol Choir for children with a first Sunday rehearsal attendance of nine!

And, so, as you can see from this rather small recounting of this past year's events, we have a legacy to honor ... God's providence and generous abundance to rejoice ... and a future to steward! In fact, if ever this generation of congregants had reason to be generous in their estimate of giving for the following year, it certainly would be this year with all the gifts and blessings we've received.

So as we consider congregants of this generation who comprise our church family, we fall into roughly three categories:

1. those who have ties to our church family but haven't contributed to it's mission and ministries;
2. those who have contributed to our mission and ministries but didn't submit an estimate of giving for this year; and
3. those who have submitted an estimate of giving and have been faithfully giving toward the completion of their pledge.

I'd like to address each of you, whichever group in which you may currently belong.

1. If you've not made a gift to First United Methodist Church of Napa recently, this coming year is such a crucial time to plan to begin giving. With so much generosity received from so many beyond our church family, this is the year to demonstrate the good faith in which we've received those gifts by investing in our own mission and ministries. Most of the gifts we've received have been given in trust that we enlarge our efforts to fulfill our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We do this by building a loving community to invite people into relationship with Jesus Christ, by growing in God's grace, and by serving our neighbor. This coming year is a time to reengage in this mission, to grow and to serve, and to give that others might grow and serve as well.
2. If you've contributed to our mission and ministries but haven't submitted an estimate of giving card this past year, the use of this card is such a help, not only for the purposes of our planning, but for your encouragement to *seek first* God's kingdom or reign. Like most of us, we may begin with great intentions to make giving to God and God's church a priority in our lives, but other pressing matters often enter our lives and take the place of those good intentions. The completion of an estimate of giving card represents a bold statement that, along with the basic needs of life, such as food and housing, our spiritual well-being deserves a first place priority—not only for our own benefit but for the benefit of those with whom we share this most blessed community.
3. And if you've been faithfully keeping your giving at the level at which you pledged this past year, we want to say thank you and suggest that your

faithfulness has contributed immeasurably to our congregation's ability to meet mission and ministry obligations and goals even in the midst of this past year's reconstruction. Your continued faithfulness in giving as indicated by a completed estimate of giving card is essential as an encouragement to others who may consider such a means of giving for the first time this coming year. It will also add to the assurance of our financial plans as we enter the new year with new staffing for communications, youth, and a range of other ministry opportunities.

Please take some quiet time to prayerfully consider the size of our gift to Napa First United Methodist Church over the coming year. Consider how many lives you've already touched with God's unconditional love and grace—and how many more lives that might be transformed across our community and beyond by virtue of your generosity.

Let us give over the coming year in a way that honors the legacy of our past, the providence and generosity we've received this past year, and the hope our newer, younger members and friends have placed in us.

And let us see you for our grand celebration on Sunday morning, November 22nd!

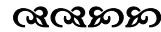

Acolyte Team News

Wictionary tells me that a Latin source of the word **candle** is *candela*, from *candeo* which means “**I am white, bright, shining.**” That phrase fits my picture of our Acolytes carrying in the Light of Christ and, at the close of worship, carrying it out to the world. Beginning on November 22, they will return to light the communion table candles at each Sunday's 9:30 AM traditional worship service.

We currently have eleven Senior Acolytes: Alyssa Ernst, Kayley Ernst, Kaley Lewis, Lydia Mitchell, DJ Quick, Lizzie Quick, Parker Rutherford, Nathan Schwarze, Caroline Simpkins, Will Tokar, and Shayley Zaccone. Natalie Schiefferly has now advanced to Acolyte Emeritus. Others may soon join her at that level, having served for as many as five years.

Being away from our home sanctuary, we haven't added any new Acolytes since May-June 2014. Now, several young people in our congregation are candidates for training. They'll have that opportunity on Sunday, November 15, meeting with Senior Acolytes for an early lunch (pizza, of course) in the Fellowship Hall at 625 Randolph. The dividing wall will be raised for a good view into the sanctuary with communion table and candles in place. We'll talk about why and how we do this ritual as part of the Napa Methodist traditional service. Then the Senior Acolytes will walk the Trainees through the process, show them what to do, let them practice doing it, and help answer their questions.

Parents, grandparents and guardians of Trainee candidates, please bear in mind that Acolytes are generally expected to be available for service at least one Sunday each month. If your child takes part in GRAPE Express, this would normally mean missing several minutes at the beginning and end of that Sunday's children's worship.
